Approximately 30 students will participate. With 10 years of experience, the Africano staff has built a trust with these youth, so they are more likely to open up and discuss these important issues.

The Cat Connection \$1,878

This year they plan to provide veterinary services to 15 low-income families. The Cat Connection will cover the cost of spay/neuter and vaccines, all necessary for the health of the cat and the safety of the family. Cat ownership can teach children from low-income families' respect for and an appreciation of animals.

Chaplains on the Way \$3,878

The emergence of COVID has caused a shift in the role of Chaplains in the Waltham community. The achievement most closely connected to First Parish has been the creation of a breakfast program, five days a week, providing a warm place and a hot meal of casseroles, juice, fruit and breads or bagels for 20-30 participants. Under the leadership of Chaplains Rebecca Sheble-Hall and Justi Godroy, the First Parish community has truly formed a partnership with the program: members make casseroles, work in the kitchen, or volunteer their time on site. Volunteers from the larger community also contribute with food donations and the all-important task of cleaning the facilities.
