We Rise Again

Easter Sunday at First Parish was a glorious time. The sanctuary was filled with springtime flowers, the music from Emma Campbell and guest horn player Alex Lee-Clark, was terrific, and there were more folk in the sanctuary than we've seen in many months. That included a lot of visitors AND returning 'long-timers' too! We were so glad to welcome you all, and hope that we'll see you, again and again, in the coming weeks and months. Just as we're seeing more and more spring flowers around the church (the grape hyacinths, daffodils and wood hyacinths are delightful) we're also feeling energy rising in the congregation. The warmer days and opportunity to enjoy more daylight and outdoor activities stirs our souls, and also our energy. In order to build on, and make the most of, all that is going on at First Parish, here are my 'top three' asks of you:

- 1. Complete your stewardship pledge to First Parish. Without your support, we can't offer dynamic and uplifting ministry in the church. Your commitment does more than keep the lights on: it supports an excellent staff, programs that educate and inspire and engage us in the larger community with our UU values. Our goal is 100 percent participation please 'be in that number'!

We've been involved in some terrific transitions work this year: exploring the congregation's history, building a new mission statement; forming a relational covenant to help us be in right relationship with one another; articulating a vision for the congregation's ministry. Talk to Dan Taylor (property@walthamuu.org) if you have facilities or physical plant skills and can give us a little time and talent. Interested in social justice and justice-making in the community? Plum Kennard (plum.kennard@walthamuu.org) would like to hear from you. And education is a life-long venture. Could you give us two hours on a Sunday to support religious education for children and youth? Pam Penton (pam.penton@walthamuu.org) would welcome you.

One of my favorite hymns is Carolyn McDade's "Rising Green" - a song for this time, for this kind of increased energy. The song calls us as our faith "settles deep in the earth," to recognize that it will be "rising green to bring a new day." So shall it be with all of us, in this place, at this hopeful time. Let's make it happen!

From the Music and Choir Director

While the term 'Resistance' often speaks to heroism and the practice of doing deeds for the greater good, in my household the word 'procrastination' would probably be more frequently used to describe the actions of the inhabitants.

There are two teenagers who visit their dad on alternate weekends (and week nights when homework is presenting challenges, or the cuisine being served looks more appealing than the alternative residence.)



Those of you who have experienced the trauma associated with being asked to help with

homework, only to have them refuse to get it out of their bag and make a start on it, will hopefully have some sympathy with the fact that my grey hairs are multiplying. Last weekend the procrastinating extended to not wanting to go out for ice cream. I was wondering what new level of chaos we were entering, only to find out that they had eaten so much lunch that the idea of trying to fit anything else in was unthinkable - for about 45 minutes!

Gabriel Faure, a French composer and organist born in 1924 was also a major procrastinator. Many musicians and listeners are familiar with his Requiem, but other than this and his 'Pavane', they struggle to name any of his other works. Faure wanted his compositions to have seriousness and gravity, believing that giving them a frivolous title would be demeaning in some way. As a result he wrote numerous pieces with the same title of 'Short Piece', 'Barcarolle', or 'Nocturne'. However, having contracted pneumonia it is said that he regretted this on his death-bed, but couldn't think up imaginative names and was greatly distressed.

I am learning No. 5 from his 'Short Pieces' for the Offertory this week. I love Faure's piano music, but don't think his lack of pretty titles prevents more people becoming familiar with his imaginative approach to harmony. The man was ambidextrous and he thinks nothing of creating tricky passages that pass between the fingers of both hands, or creating rhythmic complexities that tie some of us in knots for weeks.

Transitions News

It seems that some of you have been wondering about the status of our ministerial searches. My apologies for not providing more frequent updates. The short answer is, *we are on the move*.



The last information that I shared was that back in December, we had formed an interim search committee of Pam Penton, Deb

Jose, Donna Vanderclock, and myself. (It is usually the case that a subset of the congregation's board act in this role). At last month's board meeting we were joined by Christine Purcell, our UUA transitions program manager who updated us on the current situation with interims, which is looking better than last year. We also talked with her about other possibilities for advancing our ministry for the next church year. Based on that, we are working on a two-pronged approach to filling our ministerial positions for next year.

One is using the normal UUA Interim Minister Search Portal. Having been through this process for the past two years, it is old hat now. Following this route, we have been updating our congregational record which is due on April 20th. In early May, we will receive the resumes of interested candidates and go through the interview process. Following this path, we would find out on May 17th if we have a ministerial match.

At the same time, we have been searching for a contract minister who might be interested in working with us. Deb Weiner is open to the possibility of providing transitional ministry support next year, so that would give us a variety of options to offer to interested candidates.

And looking long term, Deb is preparing to lead us this Spring in the ministerial search process, and specifically in the steps needed for us to form a settled minister search committee. I hope that you find that idea exciting. If so, please make sure that you attend the April 30 transitions workshop (following worship) and that you consider offering to serve on the search team.



Cottage Meetings on the UUA's Changes to Article II

Article II is the section of the UUA's bylaws that includes its purposes and covenant. It currently includes the seven principles. In 2020, the UUA established a commission to review Article II. That commission is now recommending a new version of the Article that is very different. Instead of the seven principles, there will be six values focused around love.



At this year's General Assembly, there will be the first of two votes on this recommendation. (The second one will happen next year). Our general assembly delegates, <u>Katie Gullotti</u> and <u>Elisse Ghitelman</u> would like to hear your thoughts on these changes.

We will hold several meetings for people to review the proposal and share their thoughts. The first will be in person in the **Chapel at noon on Sunday, April 23**, led by Scott Tougas. Elisse will lead one on Zoom at another time. We will also have one at Ferry Beach.

You do not need to read the report to attend the meetings, but we will only have time for a cursory review. Reviewing the report beforehand will make the meeting much more enjoyable!


