#### **Planning Ahead**

"If you don't know where you're going, any road will take you there." Many of you have heard me quote that Lewis Carroll statement, which comes from *Alice in Wonderland*. You who make up First Parish in Waltham have done a great deal this year to not only explore possible

paths toward the future, but make positive changes in the road you're traveling. You have developed a new mission statement and relational covenant - both of which you (signed members of the congregation) will have the opportunity to affirm at your upcoming June 11 annual meeting.

You've responded to an invitation from members of the Nominating Committee and Board of Managers to identify those among you who you respect, trust, and would support as members of your settled minister search committee. More than seventy of you responded to the invitation to share your thoughts as to whom you might nominate to represent you on the search committee, and on June 11 this congregation's members will also have the opportunity to vote on the slate of individuals who have agreed to serve in this important role.

Becky or me and let us know that you'd like to meet with us to talk about the joys and responsibilities of membership... and then add your name to the book which holds the names of all who have expressed their support of this congregation over its long history.

And wait, there's more (as we like to say): the congregation's new Director of Religious Education, Yvonne Andrews, begins her work on June 12th. She'll be spending this summer getting to know the congregation and its families, expanding her own learning base about UU religious education, and making preparations for our religious education program beginning in the early fall. If you know families who are looking for a spiritual home and religious education programming, I hope you'll tell them about First Parish in Waltham - with the participation of all of us, we grow!

Even though the 'formal' part of the church year is winding down, there's lots more going on. This-coming Sunday, our lay worship team has a beautiful poetry service planned, with great music from members of the Waltham Philharmonic. #### From the Music and Choir Director

#### Part of (Y)our World

Many of the familiar faces we usually see attending worship on a Sunday morning will be at Ferry Beach this-coming weekend, and yet I am very much looking forward to this week's service. Members of Waltham Philharmonic Orchestra will be sharing some beautiful Chamber music with us, to accompany the Worship Team's Poetry Service. The orchestra

is a Jones Partnership recipient. This means they receive a donation from us to help fund their excellent work in the local community, and give us a mention on their fliers. Some of you may have been to one or more of their concerts - playing an instrument is not a prerequisite to attending the musical events!

Similarly, you do not need to be a member of the LGBTQ+ community to attend the Waltham Pride Festival taking place on Saturday, June 3. I know many local people will turn out to enjoy the many attractions on offer and to demonstrate their support for a community of people they do not feel they belong to. I hope you'll be there – our own Katie Gullotti will be singing – and share your support for our siblings.

With this thought of not always feeling like we are part of the community we might wish to connect with, I went to see the live-action remake of "The Little Mermaid" film this past week. It's not the type of film I would normally pay to see, but I felt compelled to attend on its opening weekend – along with 7 other close family members. The film features a black mermaid / princess, and the release of the trailer sparked an enormous number of (sometimes hateful) conversations about whether she should be played by someone who was black or white. I feel strongly that young people need to see themselves represented in all aspects of daily life. Princesses may not be high on your list, but imagine what it would be like if you only saw images of people from your community playing 'bad guys' or minor roles. I find the idea that a princess cannot be black totally abhorrent. We went as a family to send a message of endorsement to Disney, and other people with a powerful stake in children's movies, that we want to see more films with greater diversity in the leading roles.

I loved the fact that British actor Art Malik, who was born in Pakistan and only gets to play villains in blockbuster movies, actually gets a role in this film where his character is warm, funny, and incredibly kind-hearted. It was also interesting to encounter a black character

who had chosen to adopt a white child. There were male mermaids, some sisters who looked nothing like each other while representing many different continents, and a prince looking for greater economic stability for his people rather than just frolicking about on the high seas with nothing better to do with his time. Yes, some of it felt a little like 'tokenism', but the underlying message of hearing a piece of music that changes your perception of the world does not feel far-fetched to me - Elgar's cello concerto did that for me when I was a teenager. So I encourage you to consider buying a ticket and, going to see a film where the main character does not look like you - and then imagine how repeated experiences of this might make a younger version of yourself feel. When we expand our views of who is, or should be, "part of our world" and our universe, we expand our experiences and new ideas open to us. I hope you'll engage in this exploration – and then come talk to me about it!

It is a group home in Waltham that provides a safe and supportive living environment with 24-hour staffing for up to 12 gay, lesbian, bisexual, and/or transgender youth aged 14 to 18. Many of the residents have experienced difficulty at home, or in their placement, due to gender expression or sexual identities. Waltham House prepares them for what is next in their plan - reunification with families, transitioning to a foster family, or preparation for independent living. Article 5. To vote on the new relational covenant created during this year's transitions workshops.


Article 6. To vote on the slate of members as proposed by the board of managers for the Settled Minister Search Committee.

#### Seeking People Like YOU: Becoming a Member of First Parish in Waltham


