#### "For This Time" - Thoughts from Deborah Weiner Transitional Ministry Associate

"The Heat is On"

We are in the Dog Days of summer...and while, temperature wise, we can count ourselves as lucky – given that the unrelenting humidity and warmth aren't nearly what the south and west are experiencing – we've also been subject to unrelenting rain and flooding. Again, it has not

been nearly so bad - at least for most of us - as our neighbors to the north, south, and west (in Vermont, New Hampshire, Connecticut, and some parts of Massachusetts) have experienced, where devastating flooding is occurring. But still, it's been too much rain, too much humidity, and every day the news leads with stories of the heat, the floods, the tornados, the wildfires in Canada, and more.

There are climactic crises occurring in other parts of the globe, too: brutal heat, droughts that are killing crops. Our planet is on fire, and while environmental envoy John Kerry, author and activist Bill McKibben and others are trying to focus our attention on the need to change our ways NOW, for too many in power – those who value money above saving the planet – resistance and denial is evident. "Let them eat cake" is an attitude that ultimately will bring our own downfall; our alternative - the one that might help to save us all - is to do what we can to support environmental care and behavioral changes in all of us that could help to turn the (rising) tide.

While I don't consider myself a paragon around environmental change, I remember well the night when my husband Ben and I went to see "An Inconvenient Truth" in 2006. We went into the movie telling each other that we were likely to come out believing that we would need to make changes in our own lives, and we were right. We also knew that we couldn't do everything, but we could do something. We chose carefully, because we wanted to spend our limited funds in places that could make a difference. We replaced all the windows in our house - which was built in 1951 - with windows that would hold in the heat in the heat and keep the cold out. We had an environmental survey done of the house (Free!) to guide our changes. Ben re-insulated the attic with better insulation. We bought our first hybrid vehicle, a Toyota Prius (there were no electric vehicles at the time) and it made us Prius (now plug-in with a rechargeable battery) devotees forever. And, following the words of *Candide* as he realizes that the world is not all he imagined, we decided to 'make our garden grow' and expanded our organic beds so that I could grow as much of our own produce as possible.

As the words from the song in *Candide* say, "we're neither pure, nor wise, nor good - we'll do the best we know. We'll build our house, and chop our wood and make our garden

grow." That's what we're still trying to do, just a couple of people doing a few things that allow us to live our lives knowing that, at least in a few ways, we are trying to stop the planet from dying so quickly. Right now the change is that we're about to put up solar panels, which will reduce our reliance on fossil fuel by 67%. Another step forward in this struggle to save our own lives, and that of the planet.

I am no paragon, and I don't really expect you to be, either. But I am asking you, in these hot-hot-days, to think a bit about whether there are things you might do in your own life, to make the planet a little stronger; to conserve the environment we have, to help it survive a bit longer. I hope you'll think about it, and say, in the words of Edward Everett Hale, "I am one - but still I am one. I cannot do everything, but still I can do something. And because I cannot do everything, I will not refuse to do the something I can do." May it be so.

#### A message from the Office Manager:

#### How is your summer faring?

Have you won on the lottery? Have you used your umbrella? While these questions do not seem related, they feature in a training I attended as part of the AUUA (Association of Unitarian Universalist Administrators), and I wanted to share some information that was distributed.

There are multiple ways you can make a donation to First Parish in Waltham. Many of you have completed your pledge, or made a donation to the Minister's Fund or one of Trusts. (You may recall that a new trust in honor of David Wilbourn was set up). However, none of these methods offer you the security of remaining totally anonymous. To remedy this situation, the UUA (Unitarian Universalist Association) has developed a method known as 'Umbrella Giving'.

The process is simple and costs nothing. You make a single gift to the Unitarian Universalist Association – cash, stocks, annuities, bequests or charitable gift annuities - and let them know how you would like your gift to be distributed. The UUA then distributes the gift to your chosen recipient and notifies the benefiting entity according to your instructions. You cannot use this method for non-UU entities, but you can support UU organizations and even your church! You will not be named unless you want to be. We're sorry to share news that in late June, Healthy Waltham (a Jones Partnership Grantee) experienced a serious break-in and vandalism attack at their temporary location (the Fitch School). The staff found smashed windows, rotting meat and spoiled produce from refrigerator doors left open and pantry food strewn across the room. Two fire extinguishers had been discharged throughout the gymnasium and human excrement had been left on the floor.

The Healthy Waltham team is shocked and saddened by this senseless vandalism and destruction of food and property and recognizes that Healthy Waltham is a lifeline for many vulnerable families in the community. The organization has completed the clean-up and is 'back in business' with their next distribution of food scheduled for July 13th.

What affects part of the community, affects us all. Please hold the good folk of Healthy

Waltham in your heart in the days going forward - they are doing lifesaving work and we appreciate them!
