"For This Time" - Thoughts from Deborah Weiner Transitional Ministry Associate

"Patriotism, Community, and Challenges to Our Faith"

As many of you know, I was glad to be able to represent First Parish in Waltham last week at the Unitarian Universalist Association's General Assembly in Pittsburgh, PA. It was an action-packed GA, with Ministry Days, worship services, workshops, business sessions, and valuable connections with both religious

professional colleagues and old friends. It was exhausting and compelling, challenging and inspiring. Later this summer I hope that your delegates Elisse Ghittleman and Katie Gullotti and I will be able to share more about our learnings with all of you.

For now, though, I wanted to focus on two elements that I found particularly relevant to this congregation. First is the conversation connected to discussions about the 8th principle and UUA Article II Bylaw revision proposals...conversations that both put love at the center of our UU congregations, and seek to connect UUs with the community and people around them, to build connection and share the power of our congregations with the wider world. One of the presentations, on "Becoming a More Welcoming Class-Inclusive Faith Community," will be ready for viewing in a week. Another that I attended, called "Disrupting Church: Creating What's Next" is available for viewing now. What are the ways in which First Parish in Waltham can connect more authentically to the communities and people around us - and what will we learn by doing so? It's food for thought.

The second major presentation which I can not let go of, was the Berry Street Essay. This annual presentation, first offered by William Ellery Channing, is given by an esteemed UU minister and includes words from several respondents. This year's essay was given by the Rev. Cecilia Kingman and is entitled <u>"My Little Pony Was Right: Reflections of Fascisms Within and Without."</u> It is a compelling and frankly, frightening essay which explores, through Kingman's long study of fascism in the US, the risks our country is under in this troubled time. (A video version of the essay is also available on the same web page). It is also a call to action to all of us - even those of us who live in the bubble of Massachusetts. If you, like me, are interested in more deeply exploring Kingman's essay, I'd love to meet with you for more conversation, so please send me an email message!

We have an opportunity in this congregation to raise our collective voices in support of our Unitarian Universalist values; to reach out to the communities around us; to take seriously the ways in which our faith can be a restorative and liberating force for good. This is the faith I was raised in; this the faith to which you are connected, as member or friend. This is the work we need to do together - will you join me?
