



Pesach (Passover) is a celebration of freedom, and a reminder of the collective liberation we owe to our fellow human beings: we all were once "strangers in the land of Egypt." 
Pledge Drive Update

For This Time Thoughts from Deborah Weiner, Transitional Ministry Associate

"Tied Up With Ribbons"

What a day it was in church last Sunday! First of all, we believe that there were about eighty folk in worship (between in person and zoom)...a terrific number! There were not only visitors but beloveds we haven't seen in some weeks - all present and enjoying the beautiful spring weather AND the

announcements to come in the service. The place was pulsing with energy.

In case you missed it - or even if you didn't - we shared news of the **hiring of a fabulous new Director of Faith Formation for the church, beginning August 1.** April Rosario, who is a credentialed religious educator and on the *Soul Matters* staff team, will join First Parish in Waltham in the summer. Along with her spouse Chris and her two kiddos, they were in church with us for this announcement. We are beyond thrilled about April's hire! And then...this church's amazing search committee came up and announced, with unbridled joy, that **Reverend Elizabeth Carrier-Ladd will be the candidate for the settled ministry of the church.** Elizabeth, known as Elka and using they/them pronouns, is a fourth generation Unitarian Universalist (and a 'preacher's kid') who currently serves the First Parish in Dorchester MA. Elka, whose spouse is also a minister and who has four children, will begin Candidating Week here in Waltham on April 26 with a visit to the Potluck Passover Seder - and will continue through the next week with many other gatherings and opportunities to meet Elka and visit them. Check the newsletter for both signup slots for private visits with them, for the Candidating Week Schedule, and for more information on this important time at church.

And wait, there's more: our beloved Marianne Cutter - who, it turns out, had not signed our membership book - decided that it was indeed time - and she signed at coffee hour! A couple of other folk have also indicated their interest in signing and - joining with several who had previously signed this year - we are welcoming all into membership next Sunday, April 21! All of this is great news for First Parish in Waltham - and it does feel like the place is simply abuzz with great feeling. (And if you are reading this and are not a member but want to be - please reach out to Rev. Megan or me right away - we want you "in that number" too!)

And...there is one more thing that we all can do to make things just stellar, and it's important: **pledge to support this congregation.** The stewardship and finance team have asked for your support and yet we're still seeking a significant number of pledges of support which have not been received. Any ministerial candidate, any religious educator, any new member, wants to know how it is that we join together to keep our congregation financially stable. Any religious professional wants to make sure the congregation they serve can actually compensate them. Any newcomer wants to make sure that, if they decide to stick around, the congregation is fiscally stable. We all play a part in this venture, and we need to make sure that we've done our part to not only sustain, but build it.

So please - take a few minutes now to send in your pledge. If you lost those materials, email me and I'll make sure we get another set of materials for you. Or if you didn't receive anything yet - <u>tell me that and I'll connect you</u>. And oh yes, if you already pledged but are now so pumped up that you want to increase your pledge? Well, we can do that too. **But do it now...because we want to close candidating week knowing that we've met our financial goals,** so that we really can tie this fabulous package of a faith community celebrating its future, with beautiful ribbons.
