From Our Ministerial Candidate: Reverend Elizabeth (Elka) Carrier-Ladd

Dear ones,

I can hardly contain my excitement. New people are my favorite. Especially Unitarian Universalists. Each of every one of you brings a rich, complex set of stories and experiences that make you who you are. They lead you to see the world in precisely the way you do. They inspire you to make the world a more

beautiful and just place. And I get to learn some of them next week and perhaps for many years to come. What a gift!

I am often struck by my gratitude that such a large part of my vocation is relationship building. As a kid I was often in trouble for talking to my peers too much. I thrived in theater circles where community building was central. I was a misfit who had felt the sting of not fitting in so I drew people up into my world and care with gusto. I craved helping people find belonging. And now I get to do it for a living!

I know you have felt ready and excited for a new settled minister for a long time. I know that there is growing excitement amongst you about both my arrival and the arrival of your incredibly talented new Director of Faith Formation, April Rosario. I know that we all will want to hit the ground running. We may let our excitement get the best of us and carry us away.

Let us remember that we have plenty of time. Next week might feel intense and rushed and overwhelming. We all might feel the urge to get everything out on the table. To get me all the way up to speed. To tell me all of the stories, to point out all of the sacred cows and to show me all of the weird closets. I will want to know your entire life story and all of the ways in which your congregation has both healed you and broken your heart. I will want to skip the pleasantries and get straight to what healing has meant for you and where your broken heart leads you to action in the world.

We have plenty of time. This week is just about finding points of connection. Finding some understanding of each other. Envisioning what ministry in the congregation might look like with me among you. Beginning to dream of what our relationships could become.

I say this just as much for myself and for all of you: I am so eager to know you fully. And to share with you who I am. There is no rush. I hope to settle in and journey alongside you for a long time. And there is no hotwiring that kind of relationship. There is nothing quite like the depth of relationship that is built over years of working closely together on vital projects that build a community and equips it's members to heal themselves and the world. This is a marathon, not a sprint. Deep breaths. Take water breaks. We needn't rush. Let's go!

First Parish Book Club Harrington Room and on line Thursday, May 16, 2024 1:00 pm

This month's title: 'Rough Sleepers' by Tracy Kidder

After Jim O'Connell graduated from Harvard Medical School and was nearing the end of his residency at Massachusetts General, the hospital's chief of medicine made a proposal: Would he defer a prestigious fellowship and spend a year helping to create an organization to bring health care to homeless citizens? That year turned into O'Connell's life's calling. Tracy Kidder spent five years following Dr. O'Connell and his colleagues as they work with thousands of homeless patients, some of whom we meet in this illuminating book. We travel with O'Connell as he navigates the city streets at night, offering medical care, socks, soup, empathy, humor, and friendship to some of the city's most endangered citizens. He emphasizes a style of medicine in which patients come first, joined with their providers in what he calls "a system of friends."

Much as he did with Paul Farmer in Mountains Beyond Mountains, Kidder explores how Jim O'Connell and a dedicated group of people have improved countless lives by facing and addressing one of American society's most difficult problems, instead of looking away.

Pledge Drive Update -So far, so good! And still, we need to hear from many of you!




