### From our Ministerial Candidate: Rev. Elizabeth Carrier-Ladd

Oh, beloveds! I am having so much fun! You are just as warm and inviting and loving as I dreamed. I could feel that in the materials I read about you. And even more strongly I could feel it in my time with your search committee. And still, it feels so wonderful to be wrapped up in the embrace of this community.

I have remarked to several of my dearest friends and colleagues that my absolute favorite times with your search committee were the times that things were messy. The times that someone disagreed with someone else. Or called someone else on something that felt harmful. Or someone was snippy about something. I appreciate this in part because it meant they felt safe enough with each other and me to be real and raw and honest. And I appreciate this because they showed me again and again that they would love each other through those disagreements. I saw them practicing covenant in beautiful ways. While this might not have been so enticing to everyone, it was refreshing and drew me in. I want to be with people who can be messy with each other. Because being messy through the hard stuff is what community is really about.

I chose to start off last Sunday with a sermon about being real, honest and authentic. I encouraged you to be brave in sharing with me who you are. So far two of you have reached out to me to follow up on some of the words I said. Taking to heart that I truly wanted you to be vulnerable with me. This means the world to me. Honestly. Because you have brought me into your community of covenant. You are trusting me enough to let my sermon start some dialogue, especially around things that are hard to talk about or that we might disagree about. I am not looking to agree with you about everything. What I deeply long for is people who will be honest and open with me when we disagree. Not if. When. I long for a community where we can talk through things and try to understand where each other is coming from. Where we can love each other through difficult conversations.

It shows real emotional maturity to be willing to talk to me about what you heard and what it brought up for you. I aspire to be an approachable person who can hear feedback without getting defensive. And I truly care about understanding where other folks are coming from, especially if we disagree about something. I hope we can keep talking for many years to come about all of the ways we see the world. I hope we can always be learning from each other. I hope we can all work to keep our minds open to being changed by what we share with each other.

I mean it when I say that being messy and engaging in conflict lovingly is exactly what I am looking for. I have worked hard to overcome my deeply ingrained conflict avoidance. I have learned the hard way over and over again how damaging it is not to confront disagreements head on and with great love. I find your new relational covenant to be a beautiful culmination of hard work - and I am really interested in helping us find ways to keep it alive and functioning well in the life of the congregation. And what I am experiencing so far with you is a group who is willing to say hard things, do the work of changing behavior when it matters and keep practicing covenant especially when it is hard. You believe in each other. You take risks with each other. You work on building and maintaining trust with each other. You are practicing beloved community. I am here for it. What a gift!

### First Parish Book Club Harrington Room and on line Thursday, May 16, 2024 1:00 pm

*This month's title: 'Rough Sleepers'* by Tracy Kidder

After Jim O'Connell graduated from Harvard Medical School and was nearing the end of his residency at Massachusetts General, the hospital's chief of medicine made a proposal: Would he defer a prestigious fellowship and spend a year helping to create an organization to bring health care to homeless citizens? That year turned into O'Connell's life's calling. Tracy Kidder spent five years following Dr. O'Connell and his colleagues as they work with thousands of homeless patients, some of whom we meet in this illuminating book. We travel with O'Connell as he navigates the city streets at night, offering medical care, socks, soup, empathy, humor, and friendship to some of the city's most endangered citizens. He emphasizes a style of medicine in which patients come first, joined with their providers in what he calls "a system of friends."

Much as he did with Paul Farmer in*Mountains Beyond Mountains*, Kidder explores how Jim O'Connell and a dedicated group of people have improved countless lives by facing and addressing one of American society's most difficult problems, instead of looking away.


